SAVANNA FUMC ADMINISTRATIVE COUNCIL MINUTES SUNDAY, June 16, 2024 10:30 AM @ CHURCH LIBRARY

Vice-chairperson Bill Wright called the meeting to order at 10:45 am with members LaVona Grissinger, Kris Yingling, Molly Andersen, Tom Michels, Esther Losh, Kathie and Burt Prins, Pam Darrow, Mary Irons, Vivian Eaton, and Pastor Dave Yim present. Pastor Dave opened the meeting with prayer. Minutes from the previous meeting were emailed to members. Kris moved, seconded by Kathie, to approve the minutes as presented and the motion carried. Financial reports were handed out, along with a new report tracking income, expenses, and other items since 2016. Kathie moved, seconded by Kris, to accept the reports as presented and the motion passed.

FINANCE: We have been in the red for months and at the current rate we will go through our 3 special accounts (Sterk, insurance, and Brunner) in 3 years. The committee is prepared to begin the process of looking at sharing a pastor. Tom will draft a letter to the conference with our future plans and present it to the council next month.

TRUSTEES: 2 bids were received for moving the utility pole for JoCarroll Electric with Herrell Electric submitting the low bid of \$3794.68, \$3000 less than the other bid, and \$555.49 to build the H frame. Trustees will build the H frame needed, with Miller Excavating's help. Herrell Electric still needs to find the problem with getting electricity to the outdoor signs so the bill may be higher. The committee recommended accepting Herrell Electric's bid and the recommendation passed. We are still waiting on bids for the parsonage roof. U of I Extension office 4-H program was interested in using the church kitchen. The liability form that was sent to them was returned with several changes, including wanting a 5-year contract. Our other groups using the church have signed a 1-year contract. Ronda will check with the conference's liability expert, Dwayne Jackson, before we agree to that. The annual fire extinguisher inspection was done with no problems found.

STAFF PARISH RELATIONS: Our new pastor, Fernando, will be coming June 25th with Yims moving out on June 24th. We purchased a laptop for him, which has arrived, and a tablet, which should be here tomorrow.

WORSHIP: The committee meets Thursday and has been very busy with baptisms, confirmations, and receptions. Today's Father Day service included several poems and tape measures for all the men.

EDUCATION: VBS will be here soon and we are looking for volunteers to help.

EVANGELISM: Birthday cards were sent to Sylvia Reuterfors, Herb Pratt, and Connie Kramer. Mary visited Karen Hoffman who had rotator cuff surgery. Jim Ketzel had cataract surgery and has an aneurysm that is being monitored.

UWF: They will have a picnic July 2nd. The Sewing Ladies sent many items to Midwest Mission in April and have 3 more boxes of things going with Pastor Dave to the annual conference this week.

UMM: They met in June and are looking for local mission projects, such as yard work or small construction jobs. They are hosting the church picnic on July 14th with a cookout.


INTERCHURCH COUNCIL: They are waiting to get the bill for sponsoring VBS this year.

OLD BUSINESS: Our use of Dropbox cannot be transferred from Pastor Dave's account. Pam moved, seconded by Vivian, to purchase a monthly service for \$11.99 for 3-6 months, or until the church gets high-speed internet, and the motion passed.

NEW BUSINESS: Ronda needs a letter of recommendation from the Administrative Council for her Lay Servant certification. Chairperson Susan Michelle Jepsen sent a draft to council members via email. Tom moved, seconded by Mary, to accept the letter and the motion passed. A round of applause was given for Ronda's achievement. She will look into ordering a new offering envelope style. Discussion was held on helping our new pastor settle in, including providing meals and cleaning supplies and stocking the refrigerator and kitchen cupboards. LaVona and Ronda will keep us informed as to what he will need.


