Agents of Hope

Dear Friends,

Last week, I reached out to a dear friend of mine in Angola—he serves as the General Secretary of the Angolan Council of Christian Churches. After a meaningful catch-up about his family's well-being, I asked if he had been following the recent unrest in our society, as demonstrators protested a fuel price increase exceeding 33%. He replied that he had not, explaining, "I'm not on Facebook."

I urged him to take notice and consider decisive action. The reports of police brutality—actions starkly unconstitutional—required a prophetic voice from the Church. I encouraged him to respectfully yet boldly address the President of Angola, lest silence cost more lives. In response, my friend said, "Thank you for this reminder." We prayed together, asking the Lord to strengthen him and his fellow Christian leaders as they confront the injustices unfolding in Luanda.

To my deep sorrow, in the days that followed—July 28th through July 30th—at least 22 people lost their lives, and 197 were injured as peaceful protests were met with violent force. Real bullets were used against unarmed citizens. One tragic story remains etched in my heart: Silvia, a 33-year-old mother of six, left her home to search for one of her children lost in chaos. She was shot in the back and died instantly, right before her son's eyes. The trauma of that moment will echo through her family and community.

In response, my friend and other Christian leaders in Angola took courageous steps by writing a Pastoral Letter addressed to both the government and civil society. Their bold witness renews the Church's call to be agents of hope in times of crisis.

As we begin the month of August, I invite us to reflect deeply on the letter of Paul to the Philippians. Penned from a prison cell—with no certainty of survival, Paul's words offer timeless wisdom for navigating sorrow, adversity, and political tension. In this four-chapter epistle, we discover how mature followers of Christ can embrace joy even in seasons of suffering.

Philippians reminds us how to live in partnership with fellow believers—within the local church and beyond—and how to anchor our hope in the coming day of Jesus Christ. Therefore, I encourage you to take time to read this letter; its simplicity is matched only by its spiritual richness.

"And I am sure of this, that he who began a good work in you will bring it to completion at the day of Jesus Christ." Phil.1:6

May God bless you, comfort your hearts, and lead us all as agents of His hope and justice.


Chairperson Susan Michelle called the meeting to order at 11: with members Tom Michels, Lea Ann Michels, Karen Hoffman, LaVona Grissinger, Linda Stubbe, Jason Moore, Bill Wright, Mary Irons, Susan Michelle Jepsen, Kris Yingling. Pam Darrow, Deann Kramer Karen Hoffman opened the meeting with prayer. Guests from the Deeply Rooted Homeschool community gave a presentation on their community to meet at our church on 3 Fridays a month from 9-1. There would be 65 kids from 21 families. The parents must attend with the kids. Ages from baby to 15 years old. Classes do go through High School. More enrichment-type classes are offered to students who are homeschooled. The kitchen, class-rooms, and basement are needed for 5 class groups. Would like to expand to 26 families. They need some room for storage of supplies that are lockable. They need to know as soon as possible if they can meet here. It will be checked out to see if Safe Sanctuary Building Certification is needed and liability. Minutes from the previous meeting were emailed to members. Bill moved, and Mary seconded to accept minutes as presented. The motion was approved.

FINANCE: Tom reported that we are doing a little better financially, with only a \$3000 shortage each month so we can probably continue for a few more years. Pam moved, and Kris seconded to accept the financial report. The motion passed. TRUSTEES: Jason reported that he is checking on the internet connection at the church. Still working on the water lines. There is a policy in place that plaques will not be allowed. The memorial committee should meet and update the memorial book. Bill recommended that the Memorial committee revisit the policy about plaques. The groundskeeper isn't doing a good job. There needs to be a job description. Staff Parish hired him at the approval of the Ad Council. LaVona will find the job description. The committee is recommending Staff Parrish take over the responsibility of job. They have a few names to check on new people. They are working on the tree limb that is down on the ground. FINANCE: Tom reported that the finance committee needs to replace Vivian as Treasurer before the end of the year. Would like to put some financial duties on the secretary. Should write the job description and get it to Staff Parrish.

OUTREACH: Deann reported she had gone to Lions Family night and handed out flyers and had games for kids. Float for parade. There will be a band and music. There will be room for people to ride if they can't walk. Decorating the float will be done by the committee. VBS will have flyers to pass out. We could design a flyer about the church to stick on water bottles to hand out. If you are riding on the float, take candy to toss out. Jason will check on prices of water. Labels will be made by Deann.


