Moreover, our confirmands will continue to have classes and engage in one more mission project in February. We will be making plastic mat for the homeless again at Mary's house. Please, keep our young believers in your prayers.

Ash Wednesday falls on Valentine's Day (2/14) this year. The Community Ash Wednesday service will be held at our church at 6:30 pm, with pastors imposing ashes on foreheads during the service. It is a reminder that we are dust and to dust, we shall return, urging us to turn back to Jesus. Please, come join us for the Community Ash Wednesday Service on 2/14, starting at 6:30 pm. The meeting was called to order by Chairperson Susan Michelle Jepsen with members Kathie and Burt Prins, Deeann Kramer, Molly Andersen, Bill Wright, Jason Moore, Ronda Rathje, Vivian Eaton, Kris Yingling, Pam Darrow, and Rev. Dave Yim present, at 11:37am. Pastor Dave opened the meeting with prayer. Minutes from the previous meeting were emailed to members. Kathie moved, seconded by Pam, to accept the minutes as presented and the motion passed. The financial reports were presented. Bill moved, seconded by Kris, to accept the reports as presented and the motion passed.

TRUSTEES: The annual parsonage inspection was done with several items noted. There is a wall in one of the bedrooms that was damp due to the eaves needing to be cleaned. The garage and garage door have some drainage problems. There are still critters living in the attic. Ronda was given the phone number of a possible critter remover and she will call them. The kitchen remodeling is done for now. New wiring was needed and completed for all the outlets, but it was noted that was not part of the budget for the remodeling, but needed to be done. The wiring was checked in the food pantry room to accommodate another refrigerator they will be getting. The wiring problem in the library and next room has been resolved. The heat trace on the church roof is done and working. It will be turned on when necessary, with the new circuit on the breaker box in the stockroom next to the kitchen.

FINANCE: They will be meeting on Tuesday.

WORSHIP: The Hanging of the Greens service went well. Christmas Eve will have our traditional service at 10:15am and a candlelight service with communion at 7pm. Sunday, December 31st will be a hymn sing service.

EDUCATION: The Sunday School children presented their Christmas program this morning and it was great! Many thanks to Kris and her committee! There will be no childrens' Sunday School for the next 2 weeks due to the holidays.

EVANGELISM: Ann Larsen and Jackie Walker have birthdays soon. Steve Yenney and Dorothy Taylor are in our prayers. Susan Michelle brought a card for Alyssa Volkers, Burt and Peg Dauphin's granddaughter, who is having serious medical issues.

OUTREACH: They have paid all of their obligations for 2023. Planning has begun for a Souper Bowl luncheon in February.

UWF: The Christmas party was at Mary Irons' home and they weaved a plastic mat on Mary's loom. The next meeting will be in March. UMM: They met Tuesday and are reading the book, "Generations."


INTERCHURCH COUNCIL: They are preparing for Lenten services next year. Ash Wednesday is February 14, 2024, with Easter on March 31st.

PASTOR'S REPORT: Pastor Dave emailed his report and mileage sheet to members. Confirmation is going well and we have 9 youth signed up for the mission trip this summer. The Salvation Army bell-ringing is almost over and we have raised \$2500 so far! God is good! 82% of the money will stay locally. The blood drive in January already has 4 donors signed up. The district leadership training will be at Harmony United Methodist Church in Freeport on January 27, 2024. Katy Cook, a former member, wants to start a Griefshare online program and needs a church to sponsor it. Pastor Dave will get more information but is confident we will be able to sponsor her. 


