



Dear FUMC Family,

What Would Jesus Do?

Beloved in Christ,

The month that has just ended has been marked by deep sorrow. We mourn the tragic deaths of two of God's children: Renee Good, a young woman full of dreams who leaves behind children now orphaned, and Alex Pretti, who was shot repeatedly while kneeling, already subdued. These were human beings—precious lives—no different from any of us. My heart aches as I reflect on how much evil seems to grow around us, how much harm, hatred, and fear we witness in our nation each day. And so I find myself asking: What would Jesus do?

This month, we begin our reflection on the teachings of Jesus in the Beatitudes from Matthew 5. In one of these verses, Jesus declares:

"Blessed are the peacemakers, for they will be called children of God."

Friends, I know my opening words may not be easy for everyone to hear. In our time, Christians are often identified more by political positions than by love for their neighbor. Yet the Scripture for our first Sunday calls us back to the heart of Jesus's ministry. I am convinced that in our place, Jesus would choose peace, for He is the Prince of Peace.

We must also remember that the opposite of being "blessed" is to be burdened—emotionally, physically, and spiritually. A peacemaker brings healing; a tormented spirit spreads division. As we enter this new month, with all the challenges facing our society—fear, anger, hatred, and political unrest—I invite you to join me in prayer and in choosing to live as children of God.

"Make every effort to keep the unity of the Spirit through the bond of peace." — Ephesians 4:3

First, as Christians, we are called to protect the unity of the Spirit. That means refusing to label or diminish others—whether immigrant, foreigner, Black, Latino, or Asian. These are the very people often targeted because of how they look or speak. Our God is a God of justice, and justice belongs to Him. Our calling is to pray, to love, and to see every person as a neighbor

Second, as Methodists, we remember our General Rules—especially in times like these:

1. Do no harm. 2. Do good. 3. Stay in love with God.

This is exactly what Jesus modeled. He did not harm; He did good; He remained in perfect love with the Father. He entered the homes of those society rejected—prostitutes, adulterers, tax collectors, and the demon-possessed. He showed us what love looks like in practice.

So let us pray for those who mourn, and also for those ICE agents who, as human beings, carry tremendous pressure that affects their minds and spirits. I believe Jesus would pray for them, and so should we.

May we walk this month as peacemakers, as children of God, and as followers of the One who brings light into every darkness.

Vivian presented a Resolution for Appointment of Church Treasurer and Authorization for Banking Activities. This is for Rhonda Badtke to take over as the new Treasurer. As this was recommended by the finance committee it only needed to be voted on. The vote was unanimous. Molly signed the certification as chairman pro tem.

Tom Michels & Vivian Eaton reported for the finance committee that last month was the first month that we came out ahead on finances. Also our apportionments went down this year. We should thank Rhonda Badtke for taking the Treasurer job.

Outreach: Jason Moore reported that outreach will be hosting a Souper Bowl luncheon on February 8. They will be collecting cans of soup for the food pantry. Their goal is 150 cans.

Hospitality: Pastor Fernando introduced the new committee. Esther Losh is the chairman. This committee will be responsible for welcoming people to the church by hosting dinners, coffee hour, ushering, and greeters.

Education: Kris Yingling reported that the children had been to the Catholic Church as part an ongoing exchange program. Twice a year the children combine for a Bible lesson and snacks. We will host in the fall. VBS will be held June 23-25. It will only be 3 days this year. The program will still be held on Thursday night.

Interchurch Council: Linda Stubbe reported that they have been working on the Lent services. Our church will host the Ash Wednesday service.

Trustees: Jason Moore reported that the committee is working on getting bids for mowing the grass. They are working on snow removal and have decided that they can handle shoveling the sidewalk and will hire someone to plow the drive. He also reported that the youth room needs to be cleared out so there is room for the growing youth group. Education and Worship need to go through their things and find a new home for the items. He mentioned that there is a trailer outside to put things in as well as Ron Miller has offered storage space at his barn.

Worship: Linda Stubbe reported that the committee had met and are changing the time of their meetings to accommodate a new member on the committee.

Staff Parish: Kathie Prins reported that LaVona Grissinger will be sending a letter to Eric informing him that his services are no longer needed.

Vivian offered a closing prayer.


Kris Yingling moved for the meeting to adjourn.
