Our previous youth mission trip took place in 2014. After a gap of nine years, we are thrilled to announce that this year we will be sending our youth members to a mission field. The trip is scheduled from June 10th to 17th, and our group will be heading to the Mountain Tennessee Outreach Project.

In total, we have seven enthusiastic youth members and three dedicated chaperones joining us for this mission. Here is their names; Jiho Yim (6th), Jon Floming (6th), Caleb Thornton (7th), Alexis Piercy (7th), Noah Johnson (9th), Roscoe Davies (9th), Jackson Bess (9th), Pastor Dave (leader), Kathie & Burt Prins (leaders). Together, we will engage in various service projects, including painting, yard work, and the construction of decks or ramps. The area we will be serving has a significant number of substandard housing situations. Substandard housing extends beyond mere unattractiveness or outdatedness; it poses risks to the health, safety, and well-being of its occupants, as well as the surrounding neighbors and visitors. Such housing is linked to higher rates of disease, crime, social isolation, and diminished mental health.

During this mission trip, our youth members will not only strive to improve some of the substandard housing conditions but also aim to contribute to the betterment of the community as a whole. They will have the opportunity to meet new people, work alongside them, and collaborate for the betterment of the local community. It promises to be an exciting journey of learning and personal growth for everyone involved.

FUMC SAVANNA ADMINISTRATIVE COUNCIL MINUTES SUNDAY, APRIL 16, 2023 11:30AM CHURCH LIBRARY

The meeting was called to order by Chairperson Susan Michelle Jepsen at 11:20am with members Kathie and Burt Prins, Tom Michels, Molly Andersen, Paula Mayer, Jason Moore, Deeann Kramer, Mary Irons, Kris Yingling, and Pastor Dave Yim present. Pastor Dave opened the meeting with prayer.

Minutes from the previous meeting were emailed to members. Kathie moved, seconded by Mary, to approve the minutes and the motion passed. The financial reports were emailed to members. Kathie moved, seconded by Mary, to approve the reports and the motion carried. Paula told us the checking account was hacked and a new one has been opened. She also reported John LeComte has received the financial statements and will conduct an audit.

FINANCE: The committee is meeting Tuesday and will finalize their report to present to the congregation. We are short financially nearly every month and may have to withdraw money from the Sterk account.

TRUSTEES: The church roof is not leaking! Beckwith Roofing will be called to check into which option, a heat trace or sealant, would be best. Herrell Electric will be working on getting electricity to the church garage and fixing the outside lights. We are waiting to hear back from Erickson Paving on the church parking lot. There is a pine tree at the entrance of the church driveway that is dying and may need to be taken down. Jeff Law and Ron Miller are checking into fixing or replacing the church's mailbox and sanctuary lights. Jason presented a recommendation from the committee to remain open to the feasibility of having a daycare at the church. The recommendation passed with 1 nay vote. The blueprints of the church have been found and Jason asked permission to take them and have them scanned. Everyone thought this was a good idea.

WORSHIP: The committee is meeting Thursday and will discuss Mother's Day, Memorial Day, and summer worship time. The Easter services were both well-attended. Mary asked the church to reimburse church members for an Easter flower they did not receive. A new Easter banner was hung in the sanctuary.

OUTREACH: The Easter breakfast served with the Youth Mission group was very successful and delicious. The committee is ready to fulfill their Rainbow Covenant pledge.

EDUCATION: The last day for Sunday School will be May 21, 2023, with a marketplace available for the children.

EVANGELISM: Alice Riffe-Torrison celebrates her 80th birthday today. Steve Yenney has a deep wound. Joy Turner is in the hospital.

MEMORIAL/HISTORICAL RECORDS: Many thanks to Deb Long who printed the scripture on display in the narthex. It was mentioned that Ronda Rathje has a scanner.

UWF: 4 women went to see "Women of the Bible" at Sinsinawa. The district meeting is in Rockford this Saturday. The Sewing Ladies creations will be taken to MMDC in Chatham this week when the rice-meal packing supplies are picked up.

UMM: They are meeting next Tuesday, having a cookout, and finishing the book they have been studying. They will take a summer break after this meeting.

INTERCHURCH COUNCIL: The Lenten services offering was \$600. This will be used for VBS, which will be held July 17-21, 2023, with the theme "Hero Hotline."

KITCHEN: Only 1 bid was received, from Andy Hughes in Mt. Carroll. The supplies are estimated at \$12,000-13,000 and labor \$4000. Committee members are going to Spahn and Rose in Stockton to look at materials on May 4th.

NEW BUSINESS: A comment was made regarding the house fire last month, whether we do enough as a church for a local mission. Another comment was made regarding scheduling activities during the day when working people cannot attend. Burt noticed several tree limbs down at Sylvia Reuterfors' house and asked permission to clean them up. Jason will check and get the okay to do so. Dave Engaldo and Pastor Gary Panetta from Great River Outreach presented their ideas for establishing a daycare in Savanna and answered many questions. They are still in the gathering-information stage and may be interested in using our church building. Everyone agreed the Savanna-Thomson area needs a daycare, but this may take several years before it is realized.

PASTOR'S REPORT: Pastor Dave emailed his report to members.

The meeting was closed with prayer and adjourned at 12:50pm.
