

SAVANNA FUMC ADMINISTRATIVE COUNCIL MINUTES SUNDAY, MARCH 19, 2023 11:30AM CHURCH LIBRARY

The meeting was called to order by Chairperson Susan Michelle Jepsen at 12:00pm, following the Outreach committee Potato Bar. Members present were Kathie and Burt Prins, Mary Irons, Tom MIchels, John LeComte, Pastor Dave Yim, Molly Andersen, Deeann Kramer, Noah Johnson, Kris Yingling, and Jason Moore. Pastor Dave opened the meeting with prayer. Minutes from the previous meeting were emailed to members. Kathie moved, seconded by Mary, to approve the minutes and the motion passed. The financial report was distributed to members. Kris moved, seconded by Mary, to approve the report and the motion passed.

FINANCE: The committee has decided to establish a scholarship fund for mission trips from the Paul Brunner gift for \$10,000. They will also use up to \$30,000 for the kitchen remodel. That leaves approximately \$84,000. Priorities for this money include the church roof, parking lot, sanctuary lights, and solar panels. Our April communion offering will go to the youth mission trip in June.

TRUSTEES: Beckwith Roofing came and did some more repairs to the church roof. There have not been any leaks since then. Praise the Lord! The heat trace and a spray sealant have been tabled for now. Lightbulbs in the sanctuary will be replaced. We have a new drinking fountain with a bottle-filling station in the narthex, donated by Elkay. Our new RING doorbell is working well. There was discussion about blacktop vs chip and seal for the church parking lot, noting the chip and seal would be less expensive. The wiring in or to the church garage needs to be fixed as there is no electricity in it. There was discussion about getting a monitor for the pulpit so that Pastor Dave can see the screen behind him. There is a church in Oak Park that has installed solar panels and it was suggested we could take a tour of the church. Not many churches in our conference have solar panels and they could increase our insurance rates.

STAFF PARISH RELATIONS: Ronda is doing an excellent job as our administrative assistant. She attended an insurance zoom meeting and did a valuation detailed report for insurance for the church building and grounds. The value was \$2.414 million. Deeann moved, seconded by Jason, to allow Ronda to attend a PAUMC conference in April at the cost of \$150, via zoom, and the motion carried. She has redone the voice mail message for the church phone. Pastor presented a liability form that every group that uses the church must complete.

WORSHIP: We will be singing one hymn from the "Faith We Sing" hymnal weekly. A new Easter banner has been ordered. Pastor is working on organizing a praise band. We will have a sunrise service Easter morning at 7:30am, outside, weather permitting. There was some discussion of using videos of contemporary music.

EDUCATION: Today was Pretzel Sunday. A Seder meal will be held on April 2nd. The last day of Sunday School will be May 21st. VBS will be July 17-21 with the theme, "Hero Hotline."

OUTREACH: The potato bar offering was \$396 today, designated for UMCOR. The committee will serve breakfast, along with the youth serving donuts, on Easter. The proceeds will go toward the youth mission trip.

EVANGELISM: Sandy Pratt has a birthday this month. The Lisa and Lester Coers family lost their home in a fire yesterday. We will see how we can help them.

UWF: They held their Prayer and Self-Denial service this month. 5 members are going to Sinsinawa Mound to see "Women of the Bible" on Tuesday.

UMM: They are meeting Tuesday with Bonnie Davies presenting the program on her recent trip to the Holy Land.

YOUTH: They are busy raising funds for their mission trip in June. They will host a chili luncheon on April 30th and serve donuts on Easter.

KITCHEN: We are waiting for bids from 2 local contractors.

INTERCHURCH COUNCIL: The Lenten services are going well.

NEW BUSINESS: The movie, "Jesus Revolution," is coming to the theater in Savanna and it was suggested a group could attend together.

PASTOR'S REPORT: Pastor Dave emailed his report to members. The youth group received a table tennis set as a gift. We will send a check to the Mt Carroll FUMC for \$600 for our share of the rice meal packing event on April 22nd. GRO is still interested in having a day care at our church. There was much discussion about this with more information needed. He passed around a copy of the Easter letter to be mailed to members. Bang-Wool will be leaving for South Korea on April 14th and Pastor Dave will have a staycation April 17-22.

After a closing prayer the meeting was adjourned at 12:54pm.




