

The Harvest Is Plentiful

Dear friends,

As we look around Carroll County, it's clear: the harvest is indeed plentiful. From the fields that stretch across our landscape to the hearts yearning for hope, healing, and direction, there is much work to be done. Jesus, our Savior, often spoke in agricultural allegories—simple, familiar images that carried profound spiritual truths. And in Matthew 9, we see Him not only teaching and healing but also calling us to respond.

In verses 1–8, Jesus heals a paralytic. In 9–13, He calls Matthew, a tax collector, and is criticized for spending time with sinners. Yet Jesus continues His mission undeterred. I encourage you to read the entire chapter to grasp the depth of His compassion and the urgency of His call.

Matthew 9:35-38 tells us:

"Jesus went throughout all the cities and villages, teaching in their synagogues and proclaiming the gospel of the kingdom and healing every disease and every affliction. When he saw the crowds, he had compassion for them, because they were harassed and helpless, like sheep without a shepherd. Then he said to his disciples, 'The harvest is plentiful, but the laborers are few; therefore, pray earnestly to the Lord of the harvest to send out laborers into his harvest.""

Friends, imagine if Jesus were walking through our communities today—visiting our churches, schools, homes, and streets—I believe He would still say, "Pray earnestly." For Jesus would see how our world Is marked by violence, division, and uncertainty.

We are called to be light. Not dimmed by fear but brightened by grace. Not passive observers, but active laborers in God's field.

October is the season of work and witness. Our Church Conference is set for October 24th. I'll be traveling to LA for a week, in the same week the youth from across our connection are planning a visit to Savanna. Trunk or Treat 2025 will return, and we need workers for that day as well, so we may bring joy and fellowship to our community.

So let us listen to Jesus, for he is instructing us to pray earnestly. In a context where mass shootings have become part of our weekly news, and lives have become disposable.

May the Lord of the harvest send workers—bold, compassionate, and faithful—to do the work needed in such a time as this where the harvest is indeed plentiful.

Pastor Fernando offered the opening prayer. Minutes from the previous meeting were emailed to members by Molly Anderson. The minutes were approved with a correction of the lengthy discussion about Finance. Susan Michelle moving and Kris seconding. Motion passed.

Financial reports were given by Tom Michels. We're still behind on finances. Trying to find someone to replace Vivian as the Financial Secretary. Vivan handed out financial reports. 


