Chairperson Susan Michelle Jepsen called the meeting to order at 10:40am with members Ronda Rathje, Molly Andersen, Mary Irons, Tom Michels, Kathie and Burt Prins, Deeann Kramer, Jason Moore, Pam Darrow, Esther Losh, Linda Stubbe, LaVona Grissinger, Kris Yingling, and Pastor Fernando Candumbo de Castro. Pastor Fernando opened the meeting with prayer. Minutes from the previous meeting were emailed to members. Kathie moved, seconded by Mary, to approve the minutes as presented and the motion carried. The financial reports were distributed. Susan Michelle moved, seconded by Ronda, to approve the reports and the motion carried.

TRUSTEES: The kitchen remodel is almost done. The H-frame for our new electrical line is done. We have had no response on bids for the parsonage roof. The 4H group wanting to use the church building for meetings gave us a liability form from the state of Illinois and wants a 5-year contract. This is not acceptable to us and will be further studied. The compressor in the boiler room is needing the water dumped twice a month now and will be monitored. Fiber optic internet has been installed at the parsonage. We will fix the leaking faucets on the radiators in the church. We will get an estimate from a mason about a base for a possible new electronic sign in the church yard.

FINANCE: We are \$40,000 in the red for the first 6 months of the year. Tom has drafted a letter to the conference regarding changing to a part-time pastor in the future. It will be discussed again in the fall. **STAFF PARISH RELATIONS:** They will meet soon.

WORSHIP: There has been much discussion about ushers and greeters and in order to have less congestion in the narthex we will not have a greeter at the sanctuary door. Susan Michelle was outside today during worship and could hear Pastor Fernando on the radio.

EDUCATION: We had a fun VBS last week with 57 children and 25 helpers. Blessing of the Backpacks will be August 18th, hot dogs, games, and bounce house on August 25th, and Sunday School kick-off on September 8th.

EVANGELISM: Mary sent a birthday card to Erik Torrison. She and Pastor Fernando will be visiting shut-ins on Thursday. Susan Michelle talked to Sylvia Reuterfors this week and she has moved back to her house in Rockford.

UWF: They are meeting Tuesday, August 6th and donating school supplies. Molly will give the program on our school supply giveaway.



PASTOR'S REPORT: Pastor Fernando thanked everyone for his warm welcome. He is getting settled in and learning about the church building and our people. There has been much paperwork to get his religious visa but it has all been submitted and the conference has it as a priority status. He is meeting with Rev. George Woosnam to help him learn about being a pastor.


