IT'S A NEW SEASON!

September is not just a new month—it marks the beginning of a new season. A season that refreshes our surroundings and, in turn, our spirits. Summer was hot! Let me share three types of small groups Watson highlights:

1. Affinity Groups

Organized around shared passions or hobbies—like cooking clubs, bowling leagues, or book clubs—these groups foster connection through common interests.

2. Information-Driven Groups

Focused on learning, these groups follow a curriculum—such as Sunday School or Bible studies. They assume that right living flows from right knowing, and that knowledge is essential to spiritual maturity.

3. Transformation-Driven Groups

Centered on life change, these groups prioritize the experience of God and mutual support. They aim to help members grow in love for God and neighbor, becoming more faithful disciples.

As we enter this season of change—when "all leaves become flowers," revealing nature's beauty— I'm reminded that we too can grow and reflect the beauty of our true nature as Children of God. The Master of new beginnings declares: Let us embrace this season with open hearts and renewed

purpose.

Minutes from the previous meeting were emailed to members. Vivian thought there was a mistake in them but couldn't remember what. Members approved the minutes pending a correction if needed.

Financial reports; were presented and Vivian answered all questions regarding them. It was suggested we ask for donations to cover the cost of the monthly Upper Rooms and LaVona volunteered to paint a donation jar. Kris moved, seconded by Mary to accept the reports as presented and the motion passed.

EDUCATION: VBS is this week and we still need volunteers.

EVANGELISM: Mary continues to send cards, visit shut-ins, and serve them communion.

OUTREACH: The 4th of July parade was fun and well-attended by members. Members passed out bottles of water and threw candy from the float. Everyone got wet when a storm showed up!

STAFF PARISH RELATIONS: We will not hire an administrative assistant until the fall to save money. LaVona has been filling in and filing paperwork. Job descriptions for the church's employees are being updated. Someone asked about a key to the office being available and LaVona will check with Pastor Fernando.

TRUSTEES: Several members voiced their opinions on letting the Deeply Rooted Homeschool community use the church building. Karen moved, seconded by Pam, to not proceed with the idea of them using the building and the motion passed. Jason is checking on the electrical work necessary to get fiber optic internet service at the church. The church water is still stinky. We may need to get a new hot water heater or flush the water line.

They are checking into hiring a service to mow the church lawn that could include shoveling the sidewalk and snowplowing the parking lot. Jason will look into changing the pest control service.

WORSHIP: Since the Finance Committee has not met, Vivian presented the committee's desire to designate the August communion offering for school supplies.

The committee also noted they are not in charge of fundraising for the church. Blessing of the Backpacks will be August 24th. Better communication is needed as we were not aware of a new member joining the church last month and did not have a cake, flowers, or any gift for her. UWF: They are meeting at Neumiller Farms on Tuesday, August 5th and having a potluck at Deeann's afterwards.

UMM: Jason will ask Marty Brubaker, a former member, to share his story about the free meal ministry he started at his current church in Fulton.

NEW BUSINESS: Pastor Fernando sent an email to members about a singing group from Rockford giving a concert here in October. Jason moved, seconded by LaVona, to invite them to come and the motion carried. Many thanks to Jeff Law, Noah Johnson, and Joe Michels for installing the new television in the back of the sanctuary, just in time for VBS to use it.


The meeting was adjourned at 12:10pm.


