SAVANNA FUMC ADMINISTRATIVE COUNCIL MINUTES SUNDAY, OCTOBER 18, 2020 10AM FELLOWSHIP HALL

Chairperson John LeComte called the meeting to order with 11 members present:

PastorDave opened the meeting with prayer. Minutes from the previous meeting wereemailed to members. Susan Michelle moved, seconded by Mary, to accept the minutesand the motion carried. The financial reports were discussed. A motion was made byKris, seconded by Pam, to accept the reports and the motion carried.

STEWARDSHIP/FINANCE: Tom presented a budget for 2021. The committee recommends we adopt the budget and the recommendation passed.

TRUSTEES: Bob reported TMI came to check the boiler. The air pressure system is working now, after switching some thermostats. He got an estimate of \$1000 to remove 3 trees, and a motion to accept the bid was made by Susan Michelle, seconded by Pam, to accept the bid and the motion passed. Ron Miller will send a crew to help clean up the trees. John will check with the county to see if the trees along Plum River are ours, before we remove any of them. Bob received a bid from Erickson Blacktop for the church driveway and parking lot to be blacktopped of \$68,000. He will check about sealcoating them instead.

EDUCATION: Kris and Pastor Dave have talked about when Sunday School can resume. The children got to carve pumpkins last week. She hopes to have a monthly activity planned until classes can start again.

STAFF PARISH RELATIONS: The budget includes raises for the staff. New job descriptions are in the works.

WORSHIP/HEALTH: Vivian reported we will continue our outdoor services through November but will change the time back to 10:15.

EVANGELISM: Mary, Molly, and Pastor Dave are visiting members on Wednesdays.

INTERCHURCH COUNCIL: We will have Trunk or Treat in the church parking lot on Saturday, October 31st from 5-7pm. Everyone is invited to participate. The Christmas childrens' party is still being planned but will be different due to the pandemic. Betsy Kinder is asking for children's winter coats.

UMW: The group will celebrate their Thank Offering at the November meeting.

Members have made and wrapped 101 pillowcases for Big Meadows residents and our shutins for Christmas presents. They are also making more hygiene bags for Christmas presents. Several members come every Monday to sew or work on craft items.

UMM: John reported the group is inactive but must pay past dues of \$160 before they can become active again. Jason moved, seconded by Susan Michelle, to pay the past dues out of the UMM checking account and the motion passed.

NEW BUSINESS: Mary and Vivian have been working on the membership list for months and will have a report to present at the church conference. Many thanks to them for all their hard work! Susan Michelle asked for the names of the members present to be added to the minutes and Molly will do that. The internet connection at the church is very slow so Tom offered to check out why and if there is a better plan available. Vivan is trying to get a Christmas concert together but it may be taped with DVD's available or on-line due to the pandemic.

PASTOR'S REPORT: Pastor Dave emailed his report to members. Our church

conference is October 29, 2020 at 6:30pm via Zoom. He is working on having a site available at the church for members to participate. He presented a list of committee members for 2021. We will celebrate All Saints' Day on November 1, 2020. He is sending invitations to families who have lost loved ones this year to come and light a candle during the service in memory of them. He will be doing a series of sermons on stewardship during November. He will be commissioned in Barrington on November 13, 2020. The annual conference will be held virtually the following day, November 14th.


